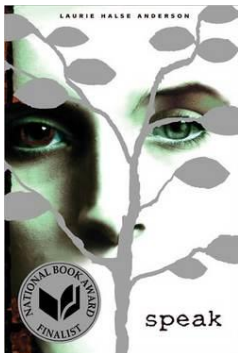
If You Find Me by Emily Murdoch

"As he graduates from high school, Thomas needs to decide whether to follow his PTSD-afflicted brother's path into the U.S. Army, or to chart a different course"--.



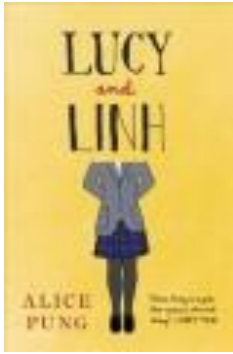
None of the Above by I.W. Gregorio

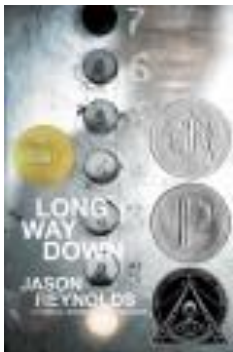
Lucy and Linh by Alice Pung

In Australia, Lucy tries to balance her life at home surrounded by her Chinese immigrant family, with her life at a pretentious private school.



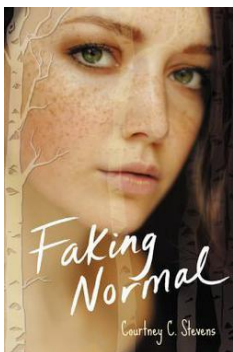
Clean by Amy Reed
