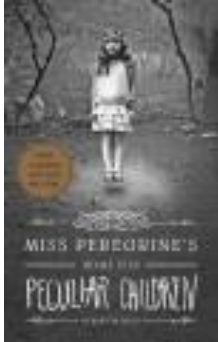

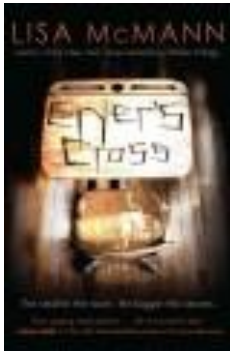
Witch & Wizard by James Patterson

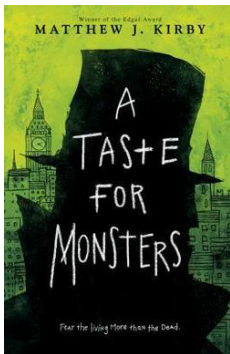
Cryer's Cross by Lisa McMann

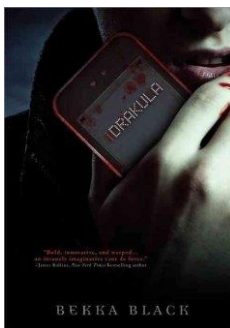
The Name of the Star by Maureen Johnson

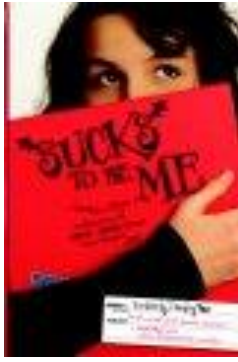
A Taste for Monsters by Matthew Kirby

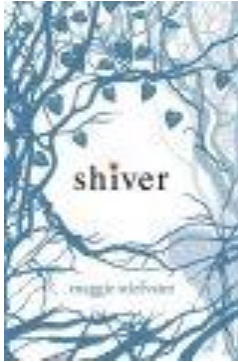
IDrakula by Bekka Black
